

MAP Grant Usage Conversion Chart

Eligibility Units to MAP Paid Credit Hour Conversion

All applicants who had received MAP benefits prior to the 2004-05 academic year (when benefit usage was measured in "eligibility units") had those eligibility units converted to MAP Paid Credit Hours by multiplying the eligibility units by 2.5 and truncating the results to a whole number (dropping the number to the right of the decimal point). This is equivalent to assessing 15 credit hours for every 6 eligibility units used. The table below shows the conversion of eligibility units from 1 to 54. Truncating the results instead of rounding benefits the student.

Limit for Freshmen and Sophomores: There is a limit on the number of MAP Paid Credit Hours that can be paid while a student is classified by your school as a freshman or sophomore. This limit is the equivalent of 75 MAP Paid Credit Hours. If this intermediate maximum is reached, a student must attain junior status for MAP grant eligibility to resume.

Total Limit: Applicants who have used the equivalent of 135 MAP Paid Credit Hours or more are not eligible for a MAP grant.
